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MEETING MINUTES

Town of Peshtigo Monthly Board Meeting

Tuesday, April 21, 2026 – following Annual Town Meeting of Electors

- 1) Call to order: Chairperson Friday called the meeting to order at 7:53pm, directly following Annual Town Meeting of Electors.
- 2) April 7th election results for Supervisors 3 and 4: Chairperson Friday thanked Supervisor 4 Daryl Joy for his time and efforts on the board for the last 2.5 years! She then congratulated and welcomed Supervisor 4 Michael Ryder on his new elected position. Chairperson Friday also congratulated Supervisor 3 Tim Bergeson on his re-election.
- 3) Roll call: All present.
Chairperson Friday, Supervisor Coble, Supervisor Wortner, Supervisor Bergeson, Supervisor Ryder
- 4) Verification of proper notice: Chairperson Friday verified.
- 5) Approve agenda: Chairperson Friday motioned to approve with the elimination of agenda item #18 (no longer needed) and moving #9 to immediately follow this motion. Unanimous consent to approve.

 - a. TOP Fire Department is assisting with the 2026 Bellin Heart Run/Walk on April 25th.
 - b. Town is expected to qualify for the WI Disaster Fund for relief from the March blizzard, reimbursing up to 70% of incurred costs over a 48-hour period during the cleanup.

Apparatus and Equipment Status:

- Our new fire engine (E-205) was taken to Red Power Diesel for some warranty work today and will be out of service for about two weeks.
- Engine 207 is back in service serving as our first due engine until E205 returns.
- Once E-205 returns to service, our old engine will be prepped and offered for sale as surplus.
- Station air compressor pressure relief switch malfunctioned again requiring replacement.

Training:

- Five firefighters completed Annual Hazardous Materials Technician Refresher training with Marinette Fire Dept. on Saturday, May 9th.
- Annual Hose Testing/Training is underway with hose being tested on May 11th and 18th.

Fire Prevention, Education and Community Involvement:

- Smoke alarms were installed at three residences during the past month. Our supply of free smoke alarms is nearly exhausted. The program will not be extended at this time due to lack of requests.
- Provided road closure assistance at the Bellin 5K Heart Run on Saturday, May 2nd.
- Two fire inspections completed for new businesses.

Fund Raising & Donations:

- TOPFD Supporter T-Shirts are still available for \$25 each with proceeds going to raise funds for the purchase of equipment for our new engine.
- Thanks to Steve Wolfe for a generous donation to our firefighters.

Personnel:

- Fire Commission met on May 7th. Dave Buechler was reappointed chairperson and Jim Meyer Vice-Chair.
- One new application received.
- Our roster currently stands at 20 volunteer firefighters. We are currently accepting applications.
